Seychelles Whale Shark Odyssey - 7 nights on SY Sea Star & SY Sea Bird

A joint initiative between Silhouette Cruises and the whale shark monitoring programme of the Marine Conservation Society of Seychelles (MCSS), this 7-night live-aboard trip in Seychelles aims to combine the intense fun and excitement of swimming with whale sharks amidst the islands' beautiful scenery, together with the enriching experience of learning more about these massive creatures by participating in actual scientific monitoring work being carried out by the MCSS.

Accommodation on Sea Star/Sea Bird

This programme hosts guests onboard the SY Sea Star and SY Sea Bird - ideal platforms for guests to be able to maximise their chances for whale shark encounters in a convenient, comfortable and cost-effective way. While snorkelling with whale sharks may be the main highlight of the programme, it is far from the only thing on offer. About the I tinerary

Whale sharks are wild animals and while MCSS have identified their usual favourite feeding places these can vary on even a day-to-day basis.

As such, our ability to locate the whale sharks is weather dependent as rain or high winds stop the microlight aircraft from flying. Because of this the itinerary should be regarded as a guide only and we will reschedule days to enable us to make the most of the situation during the week; days may also shift around due to poor sighting conditions or days when the sharks are not at the surface

Following any encounters, the vessel will cruise back toward Mahé for overnight anchorage near the Ste Anne Marine Park. In the evening, we will have a final de-briefing and a farewell BBO.



Useful Information & Travel Tips

- Your safety and comfort are our highest priority. In the event of adverse conditions, all itineraries are subject to change at the captain's discretion.
- Be sure to bring plenty of sun-screen, a cap or hat and sunglasses -Seychelles is generally warm and sunny throughout the year and the sun's rays can be especially impactful onboard the vessel, due to the reflection from the sea.
- Bring suitable footwear for walking on deck and on the beach, as well as in shallow water (some island visits require embarking/disembarking from dinghies in shallow water).
- There are numerous opportunities to dive on most days of the itinerary, and we can also conduct introductory dives for novices. Contact us for dive rates and equipment rental fees.
- Water skiing and tube rides are available at very reasonable rates. Snorkelling equipment and kayaks are included in the cost of the cruise.
